

i. INTRODUCTION

The American Community Survey (ACS) is not just a data source, it is an essential lifeline for our communities. Its detailed, year-round information on education, employment, housing, and more drives decisions that can mean the difference between safety and vulnerability. In the wake of a natural disaster, ACS data can guide emergency responders to where help is needed most. For small business owners, it provides the insights to make smart investments, grow local economies, and create jobs.

Yet despite its critical role, the ACS remains less well-known than the decennial census — and it faces ongoing threats to its funding, scope, and quality. Weakening the ACS would diminish our ability to respond to crises, plan for recovery, and build thriving communities. That's why we must act now to protect and strengthen it.

To raise awareness, the Census Counts coalition has designated August as ACS Awareness Month. This toolkit provides ready-to-use graphics and resources to educate communities and highlight why ACS data is vital to our communities. 
